



Is Wisdom a Lot of Language?



DEDICATION

Carl Sandburg, familiar to thousands with his imposing figure and snowy shock of hair, started his literary career in the twenties as a journalist. His rise to fame as a poet began with his *Chicago Poems* and the Pulitzer Prize-winning Lincoln biographies. He fused a homely wit with his musical instinct to produce *American Songbag*, a collection of American folk songs which resurrected an up-to-then forgotten art. Sandburg was himself a mellow-voiced minstrel who communicated his ideas not only to the elite and the educated, but also to those of humble birth and limited learning. Unpretentious and sensible, Sandburg "loved the people of the earth,

the family of man." Our uncrowned poet laureate undeniably captured the homespun flavor of American culture and still remains unequaled as the scribe of American ideals. His peaceful death at the age of eighty-nine on July 22, 1967, meant for the American people a sad parting with a vigorous man who loved all aspects of life, both grand and basic. The mirrors of his thought — poems of deceptive simplicity and folksongs praising innocent pleasures — will continue to have meaning for coming generations. His message of compassion and love creates a medium of communication understood by all peoples.



The people is Everyman, everybody. Everybody is you and me and all others. What everybody says is what we all say. And what is it we all say? . . .

When shall we all speak the same language? And do we want to have all the same language? Are we learning a few great signs and passwords? Why should Everyman be lost for words? . . .

Over the ether crash the languages.

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



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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE


faculty, students, parents, and community would do well to listen to each other at all times and thereby, I am sure, establish valuable lines of communication.
